Hi, My name is Emma and I'm one of the "Fantastic Five" team from IAS, Gloucester. I work for Individual Ability Support where we support people with disabilities within the community. Thank you for having me here tonight to help spread the word about our upcoming Fundraising Event – The Fantastic Five's Hair Dilemma. This year will be our 4th year in hosting an event like Australia's Biggest Morning Tea for the Cancer Council but with a twist. This event will be held on **Thursday 27th June at 12pm down at the Individual Ability Support House in Church Street** where 5 "ins-pour ational" ladies - Sharon, Belinda, Jeanette, Kerrie and I will be shaving our hair off in hope to raise our goal of \$1,000 or as much funds as possible to help put an end to cancer. The reason for the Fantastic Five are so passionate about this cause is, we all have had loved ones affected by this disease, and we want to do our part in helping make a change. Cancer affects almost 1 in 2 Australians before the age of 85, every 4 minutes, someone in Australia is diagnosed with cancer, 4 minutes, the time it takes to make a cuppa, 150,000 Australians are diagnosed with cancer every year. The much needed funds go towards vital cancer research – this has helped increase cancer survival rates from 49% in the 1980's to 69% today, support services – 4.56m people will be diagnosed with cancer over the next 25 years, 4.56m families, who will be in need of support, prevention programs – one third of all cancers can be prevented, with cancer prevention being one of the most effective ways we can create a cancer free future and advocacy – just like tonight, I am just an everyday person, who wants to express her wishes to create change and support in fighting against cancer on the behalf of those affected by it. So far, the over \$500 we have raised has helped to provide 330 kids with a SunSmart education, 7 calls to trained cancer professionals or 4 days of PHD student's (a doctoral student who has been accepted into a doctoral program) world – class research. Cancer Council Australia is a national, non-profit organisation who are Australia's leading cancer charity, and the only Australian charity working across every aspect of every cancer, from research to prevention and support. Their vision is a cancer free future, and every day across Australia, their association is working towards that, helping to reduce the physical, emotional, and financial burden of cancer on the lives of all Australians. The Cancer Council will continue to work towards a cancer free future. We all want to achieve a purpose to change the path of cancer and to ensure no one walks alone. It is heartwarming to see everyone united for such a meaningful cause. Together, we can make a difference so please lock in the date **Thursday 27th June**. It'll be "a piece of cake" for you onlookers watching these ladies shave their hair off thanks to David Bowen who has volunteered his time. It's going to be a fun filled day with lots of games / activities, laughter, yummy food, good company, and lots of prizes to be won. Thank you.
